You will need your SI stick, or you can hire one at the event. There are plenty of controls near the assembly area. There are electric BBQs and toilet facilities at the assembly area which adjoins the Woodlands Flora and Wetlands area.

Day 3 - Royal Park, Parkville; Keilor Downs College, Keilor Downs


Entries close on 28th February.

Sportident Air contactless SIAC punching will be possible at all six races. SI units will be in "beacon mode" for contactless punching but will also record normal SI sticks that are "punched" in the normal way.

Sprint conjures up thoughts of flat out racing for 20 minutes. While this may be true for our elite and younger athletes, you will find the more mature orienteers often taking their time to complete the course. Sprint orienteering features short fast-paced events held in very runnable park or urban environments. It is all about rapid decision making. A sprint course is designed to test your ability to interpret the map in complex environments, and to plan and carry out route choices while moving as fast as you can. There are courses for all ages, even if your legs don't move as fast as they used to! The challenge is as much mental as it is physical - a "sprint for the mind".

Competitors who enter all six races will pay the following total entry fee: M/W21E \$110; M/W17-20E \$65; Other classes – Senior \$96; Junior (20 or under) \$54

The Saturday and Sunday events of the Melbourne Sprint Weekend will be a round of Orienteering Australia's National Orienteering League (NOL).



New Map "Mt Lofty"
